Numeracy - building awareness for our students and parents of the connection between numeracy and the greater community; encouraging a growth mindset and belief that we are all "Math people."

Literacy - implementation of a school-wide structured literacy program and early intervention to support our students who struggle with independent reading and/or are reading below expectations.

Our Progress

<u>Literacy</u> -

We purchased a new decodable text reading program for both in-class and take-home reading practice.

Our Kindergarten-Grade 2 staff participated in literacy focused PD opportunities through the ISD continuous improvement plan learning network. Weekly emails to families with information and strategies to try at home.





Numeracy

We used our "November Numbers" initiative to encourage our students and families to be talking, thinking, and participating in numeracy rich tasks. The activities consisted of a daily math problem, weekly "learn and then teach" card games for students to show families, and a school-wide Numbers Games Afternoon.
